GENERATIVE AI- REGIONAL CAMPUSES

The Student Life Survey is administered annually by the Center for the Study of Student Life in the Office of Student Life at The Ohio State University. In spring 2024, this survey was sent to the full population of students at the regional campuses at The Ohio State University (n = 4,162). Approximately 882 students participated in the survey for a response rate of 21.2%. The purpose of this report is to examine students' experiences interacting with Generative Al programs. The data are weighted to be representative of the general student population at Ohio State.
