# INTRODUCTION

The following data are from the American College Health Association's (ACHA) National College Health Assessment III (NCHA), a voluntary, web-based survey that assesses topics of general health and wellness among college students. Ohio State participates in this national survey every few years, most recently in spring 2021. As part of the 2021 survey, student respondents were asked a variety of questions related to their alcohol and cannabis use. Results are highlighted below and include 1,378 student respondents, though not all respondents answered every question. The response rate was 13.8%. Significant changes were made to the NCHA survey instrument for the 2021 survey compared to previous years.

Sample sizes per question differ slightly because students were not required to answer every question and some questions were only displayed based on a student's response to other survey questions. Due to low response rates, results should be interpreted with caution and should not be assumed to be generalizable. Please contact the Center for the Study of Student Life with any questions.

# HIGHLIGHTS

- 80.3% of Ohio State students chose NOT to binge drink<sup>1</sup> the last time they drank in a social setting
- A majority of Ohio State students reported that they have NOT driven after consuming <u>any</u> amount of alcohol in the past 30 days (87.8%)
- **17.5%** of Ohio State students reported <u>never</u> drinking alcohol
- More than half of Ohio State students reported that they have <u>never</u> used cannabis for nonmedical reasons (58.9%)

# **UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS**

- 77.0% of undergraduate students chose NOT to binge drink the last time they drank in a social setting
- **89.6%** of undergraduate students reported that they have NOT driven after consuming <u>any</u> amount of alcohol in the past 30 days
- **19.4%** of undergraduate students reported <u>never</u> drinking alcohol
- A majority (58.5%) of undergraduate students reported that they have <u>never</u> used cannabis for non-medical reasons

# **GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS**

- 91.0% of graduate/professional students chose NOT to binge drink the last time they drank in a social setting
- 82.7% of graduate/professional students reported that they have NOT driven after consuming any amount of alcohol in the past 30 days
- Only 11.7% of graduate/professional students reported <u>never</u> drinking alcohol
- A majority (60.4%) of graduate/professional students reported that they have <u>never</u> used cannabis for non-medical reasons

<sup>1</sup> Binge drinking is defined as having five or more drinks in one sitting.


# FREQUENCY OF DRINKING - UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS


As shown in the table below, a large majority of all Ohio State undergraduate survey respondents chose not to binge drink in the past three months. Of undergraduate students that reported drinking over the past three months, just under 70% had fewer than five drinks the last time they drank in a social setting. When asked how many drinks they consumed the last time they drank alcohol socially, undergraduate students most commonly reported that they had only one to two drinks.





When asked about the last time they consumed alcohol, 19.4% of undergraduate students at Ohio State reported that they had never consumed alcohol while 9.6% reported that it had been more than three months since their last drink. About half (50.6%) of undergraduates reported that they had consumed alcohol within the last two weeks. Additionally, 89.6% of undergraduate students reported that they do not drive after consuming alcohol.












# Within the last 30 days, did you: Drive after drinking <u>any</u> alcohol? (Undergraduate, *n* = 531)

# CANNABIS USE – UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

The NCHA survey instrument asks when, if ever, a respondent used cannabis medically or nonmedically. More than half (55.3%) of undergraduates reported that they have never used cannabis for any reason. Of students that have used cannabis for any reason, only 14.5% reported use within the past two weeks. Further, almost 20% of students reported that their last cannabis use occurred at least three months ago. When asked specifically about lifetime non-medical use, 41.6% of undergraduate students reported non-medical cannabis use.

# **RESULTS FOR GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS**


# FREQUENCY OF DRINKING - GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS

Over 90% of all graduate/professional Ohio State survey respondents chose not to binge drink in the past three months. Among graduate/professional students that reported drinking in the last three months, just over 11% reported consuming five or more drinks in one sitting. Further, when asked how many drinks they had the last time they drank alcohol socially, graduate/professional students most commonly reported that they only consumed one to two drinks.






Only 11.7% of graduate/professional students at Ohio State reported that they have never consumed alcohol while 7.1% reported that it has been more than three months since their last drink. Of graduate/professional students that had consumed alcohol, 74.4% reported that they had not consumed five or more drinks of alcohol in one sitting within the past two weeks. Additionally, 82.7% of graduate/professional students reported that they do not drive after consuming any amount of alcohol.



# When, if ever, was the last time you drank alcohol? (Graduate/Professional, *n* = 326)









# Within the last 30 days, did you: Drive after drinking <u>any</u> alcohol at all? (Graduate/Professional, n = 208)

# **CANNABIS USE – GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS**

The NCHA survey instrument asks when, if ever, a respondent used cannabis medically or nonmedically. Just over 57% of graduate and professional students reported that they have never used cannabis for any reason. Of students that have used cannabis for any reason, only 8.3% reported use within the past two weeks. Additionally, 20.6% noted that their last use was more than one year ago. When asked specifically about lifetime non-medical use, 39.6% of graduate and professional students reported non-medical cannabis use.

# CONCLUSION

Alcohol use, substance use and binge drinking among college students is a continuing concern for student wellness administrators and practitioners. This report examines alcohol and cannabis use among undergraduate and graduate/professional students at The Ohio State University in 2021 through an analysis of data from the ACHA-NCHA III. In total, 80.3% of Ohio State students choose not to binge drink. Additionally, a large majority of both undergraduate (77%) and graduate/professional (91%) students do not binge drink.
