EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report covers the combined results for the Summer 2023, Autumn 2023 and Spring 2024 Ohio State Graduation Surveys. An invitation to the Graduation Survey was sent to all undergraduate, master's, doctoral and professional degree recipients who were scheduled to graduate in the summer, autumn or spring terms of the 2023-2024 academic year.

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for undergraduate students was **57.0%**; 6,950 submitted responses.
- **88.2%** were satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their experience at Ohio State.
- **48.1%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **26.5%** reported their debt would be \$20,000 or more.
- **35.8%** reported that they had accepted an employment position or were continuing with their current employer.
- **25.4**% reported that graduate or professional school was most likely to be their primary post-graduation plan.
- **73.9**% reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.

MASTER'S DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for master's degree recipients was **44.6**%; 1,165 submitted responses.
- **89.6%** were *satisfied* or *somewhat satisfied* with their experience at Ohio State.
- **54.4**% reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **17.3**% reported their debt would be \$50,000 or more.
- **54.3**% reported that they had accepted an employment position or were continuing with their current employer.
- **78.1%** reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.

DOCTORAL DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for those earning a doctoral degree was **61.8%**; 546 submitted responses.
- 87.8% were satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their experience at Ohio State.
- **75.0%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **10.0%** reported their debt would be \$50,000 or more.
- **67.8%** reported that they had accepted an employment position or were continuing with their current employer.
- 77.9% reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.

PROFESSIONAL DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for those earning a professional degree was 34.0%; 291 submitted responses.
- 90.1% were satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their experience at Ohio State.
- **14.2%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **74.7%** reported their debt would be \$50,000 or more.
- **73.2%** reported that they had accepted an employment position or were continuing with their current employer.
- 86.0% reported that Ohio State prepared them very well or generally well for the job market.



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INTRODUCTION

The Ohio State University Undergraduate and Graduate/Professional Graduation Surveys were first administered in the Spring term of 2011 and are administered at the end of each term by the Office of Student Life. The surveys gather information about the experiences, satisfaction and career and education plans of graduating students, as well as their permanent contact information. This report covers the combined results for the 2023-2024 academic year and includes demographic information about students who were invited to take the surveys, as well as the survey-takers.

DESIGN

The surveys were designed by representatives from the Registrar's Office, the Office of Institutional Research and Planning, the Office of Student Life, University Communications and the Alumni Association. Two surveys were developed - one for undergraduates and one for students earning graduate or professional degrees.

The surveys include the following sections: future contact information, students' satisfaction with Ohio State, students' immediate career plans, students' future education plans and the amount of debt incurred in pursuit of their degrees. In addition, undergraduate students are asked questions about the curriculum and about their co-curricular experiences.

Over the past few years, the survey has undergone several revisions. Some items have been added or changed, and some response options have been edited to better reflect student perspectives.

INVITATIONS AND RESPONSE RATES

Students who applied to graduate were invited to take the appropriate survey. If students planned to graduate with more than one degree, they received only one invitation. If students planned to graduate with both an undergraduate and graduate degree in the same major, they were invited to take the graduate or professional survey. Graduating students from all campuses were invited to take one of the two surveys.





Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family?




DEBT

At the time you graduate, approximately what will be the total amount borrowed to finance your education that you are personally responsible for repaying? Undergraduates (n = 6,471)




POST-GRADUATION PLANS





How well do you think Ohio State has prepared you for the job market? Undergraduates (n = 4,132)








During your time at Ohio State, in which of the following did you participate? (Select all that apply) Undergraduates (n = 5,321)





Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Master's (n = 1,084)




Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family?







At the time you graduate, approximately what will be the total amount borrowed to finance your education that you are personally responsible for repaying? Master's (n = 1,025)




POST-GRADUATION PLANS







How well do you think Ohio State has prepared you for the job market? Master's (n = 830)











Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Doctoral (n = 526)






DEBT

At the time you graduate, approximately what will be the total amount borrowed to finance your education that you are personally responsible for repaying? Doctoral (n = 511)




POST-GRADUATION PLANS





How well do you think Ohio State has prepared you for the job market? Doctoral (n = 471)











Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Professional (n = 272)




Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family? Professional (n = 260)






DEBT

At the time you graduate, approximately what will be the total amount borrowed to finance your education that you are personally responsible for repaying? Professional (n = 261)












