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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report covers the combined results for the Summer 2018, Autumn 2018 and Spring 2019 Ohio State Graduation Surveys. An invitation to the Graduation Survey was sent to all undergraduate, Master's and professional degree recipients who were scheduled to graduate in the Summer, Autumn or Spring terms of the 2018-2019 academic year.

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for undergraduate students was **57.8%**; 6,626 submitted responses.
- **88.8%** were *satisfied* or *somewhat satisfied* with their experience at Ohio State.
- **40.8%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **35.9%** reported their debt would be \$20,000 or more.
- **70.2%** *strongly agreed* or *agreed* that the benefits from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs.
- **70.6%** reported that paid employment was most likely to be their principal activity after graduation; of those, **74.6%** reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.
- **25.6%** reported that graduate or professional school was most likely to be their principal activity after graduation.

MASTER'S DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for Master's degree recipients was **41.5%**; 1,232 submitted responses.
- **89.3%** were *satisfied* or *somewhat satisfied* with their experience at Ohio State.
- **43.4%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **24.0%** reported their debt would be \$50,000 or more.
- **76.1%** *strongly agreed* or *agreed* that the benefits from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs.
- **85.6%** reported that paid employment was most likely to be their principal activity after graduation; of those, **82.6%** reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.

PROFESSIONAL DEGREE RECIPIENTS' HIGHLIGHTS

- The response rate for those earning a professional degree was **35.4%**; 293 submitted responses.
- **82.5%** were *satisfied* or *somewhat satisfied* with their experience at Ohio State.
- **11.9%** reported that they will graduate with no debt that they are personally responsible for repaying; **28.6%** reported their debt would be \$100,000-\$199,999 and **38.6%** reported their debt would be \$200,000 or more.
- **63.5%** *strongly agreed* or *agreed* that the benefits from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs.
- **93.0%** reported that paid employment was most likely to be their principal activity after graduation; of those, **81.5%** reported that Ohio State prepared them *very well* or *generally well* for the job market.



INTRODUCTION

The Ohio State University Undergraduate and Master's/Professional Graduation Surveys were first administered in the Spring term of 2011 and are administered at the end of each term by the Office of Student Life. The surveys gather information about the experiences, satisfaction and career and education plans of graduating students, as well as their permanent contact information. This report covers the combined results for the 2018-2019 academic year and includes demographic information about students who were invited to take the surveys, as well as the survey-takers.

DESIGN

The surveys were designed by representatives from the Registrar's Office, the Office of Institutional Research and Planning, the Office of Student Life, University Communications and the Alumni Association. Two surveys were developed - one for undergraduates and one for students earning Master's or professional degrees. Graduate students completing PhDs are not surveyed because PhD graduates are invited to take the Survey of Earned Doctorates, which duplicates many of the items on the Graduation Survey.

The surveys include the following sections: future contact information, students' satisfaction with Ohio State, students' immediate career plans, students' future education plans and the amount of debt incurred in pursuit of their degrees. In addition, undergraduate students are asked questions about the curriculum and about their co-curricular experiences.

The career and the future education items for the undergraduate survey were taken from the Association of American Universities Data Exchange (AAUDE) survey. For the Master's and professional students' survey, the AAUDE items were adapted to reflect appropriate language (for example, "major" or "minor" was changed to "field"), and the dollar ranges for the item about debt were adjusted to reflect more likely ranges for Master's and professional students.

Over the past few years, the survey has undergone several revisions. Some items have been added or changed, and some response options have been edited to better reflect student perspectives.

INVITATIONS AND RESPONSE RATES

Students who applied to graduate were invited to take the appropriate survey. If students planned to graduate with more than one degree, they received only one invitation. If students planned to graduate with both an undergraduate and graduate degree in the same major, they were invited to take the Master's/Professional survey. Graduating students from all campuses were invited to take one of the two surveys.

- Undergraduate degree recipients: 11,458 were invited to take the survey and 6,626 responded, for a response rate of 57.8%
 - Of the undergraduate respondents, 149 earned two bachelor's degrees.
- Master's degree recipients: 2,968 were invited to take the survey and 1,232 responded, for a response rate of 41.5%
 - Of those earning Master's degrees, 10 who responded earned a second Master's degree and 3 earned a professional degree in addition to their Master's degree.
- Professional degree recipients: 828 were invited to take the survey and 293 responded, for a response rate of 35.4%.

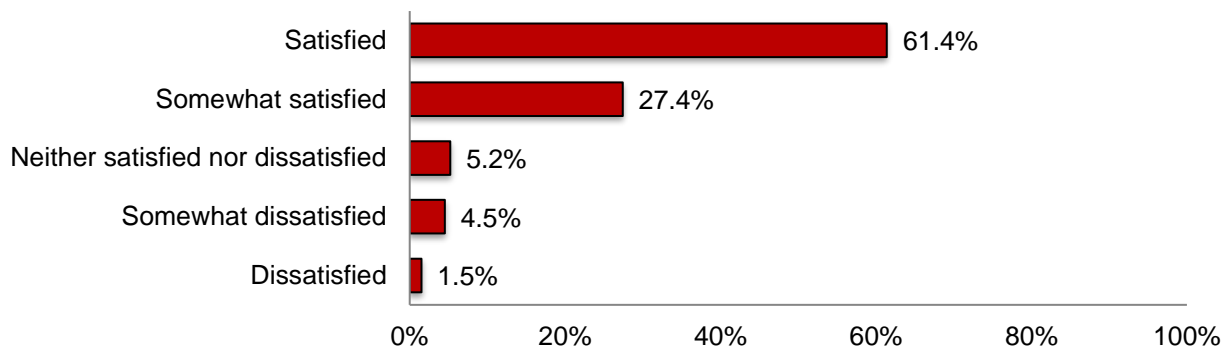

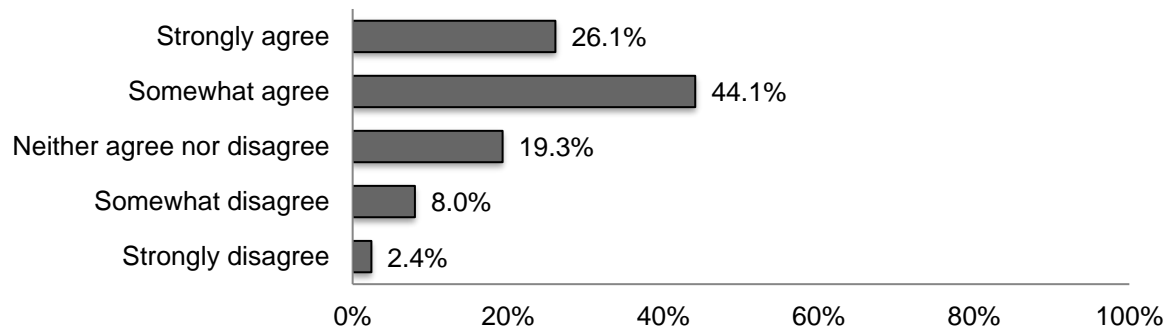

Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Undergraduates (n = 6,531)

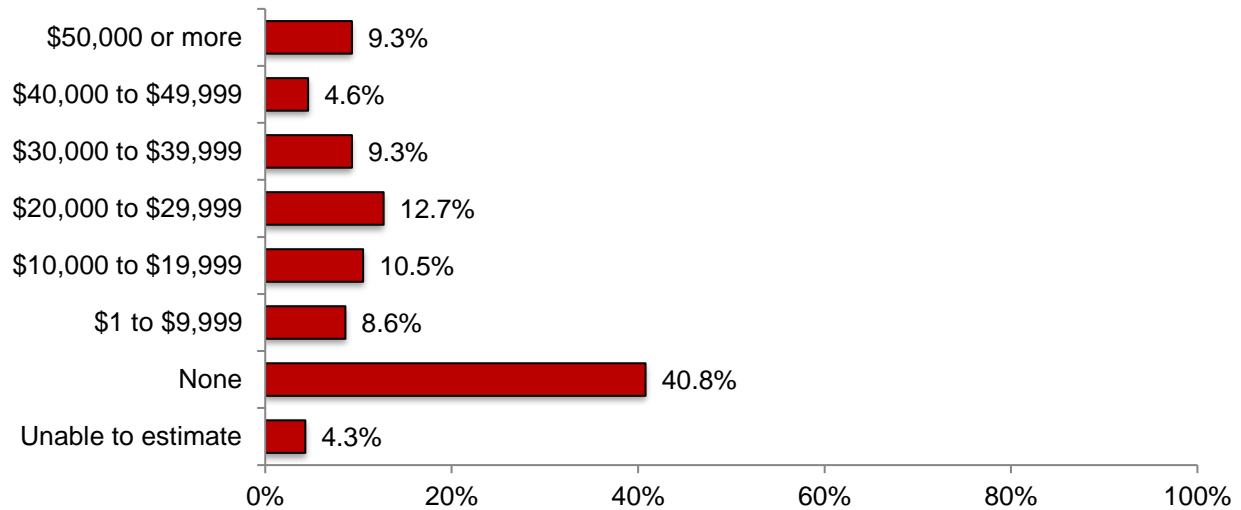


Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family? Undergraduates (n = 6,545)



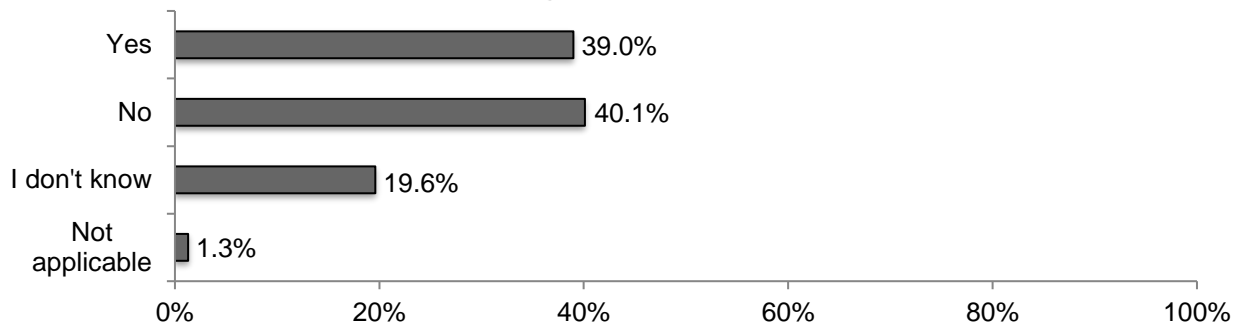
DEBT

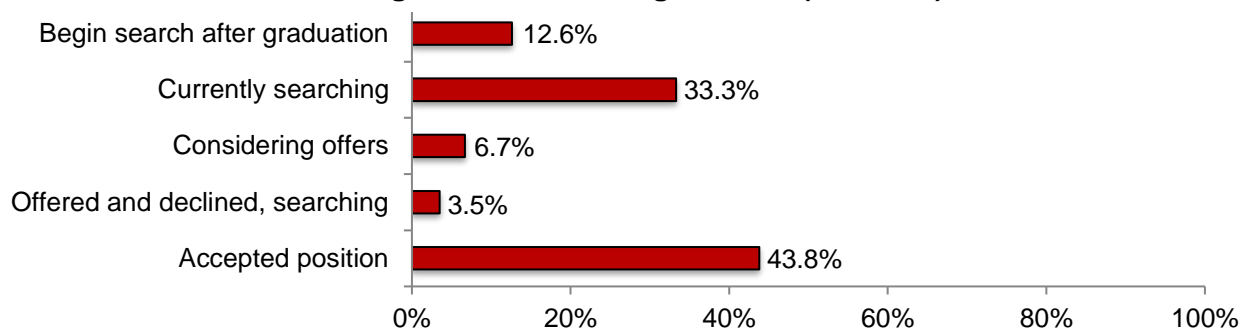

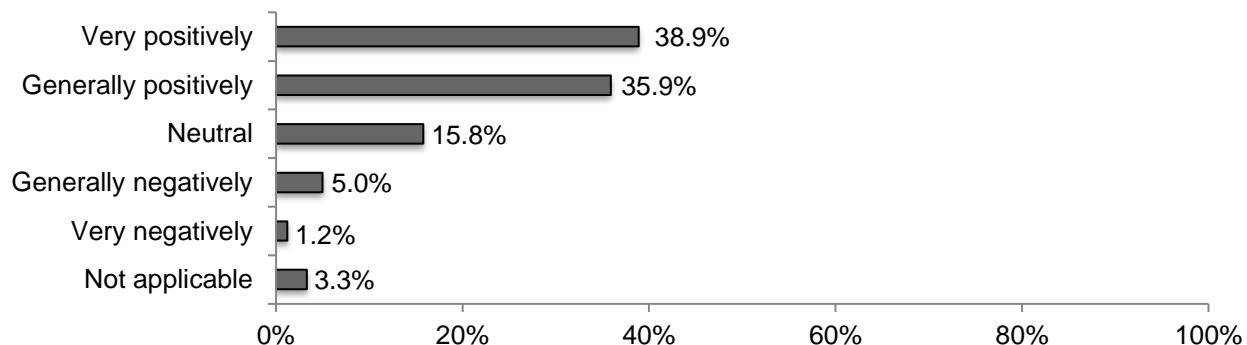

To what extent have your overall undergraduate experiences influenced your plans for graduate or professional studies? Undergraduates (n = 6,317)



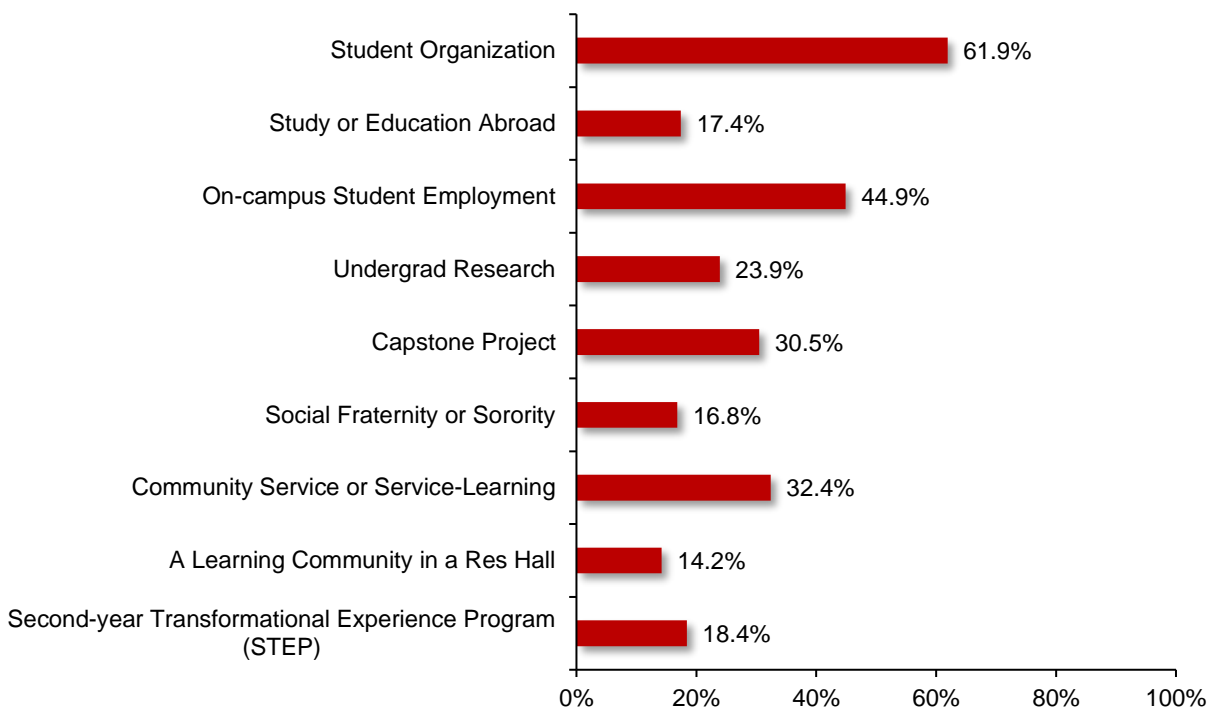

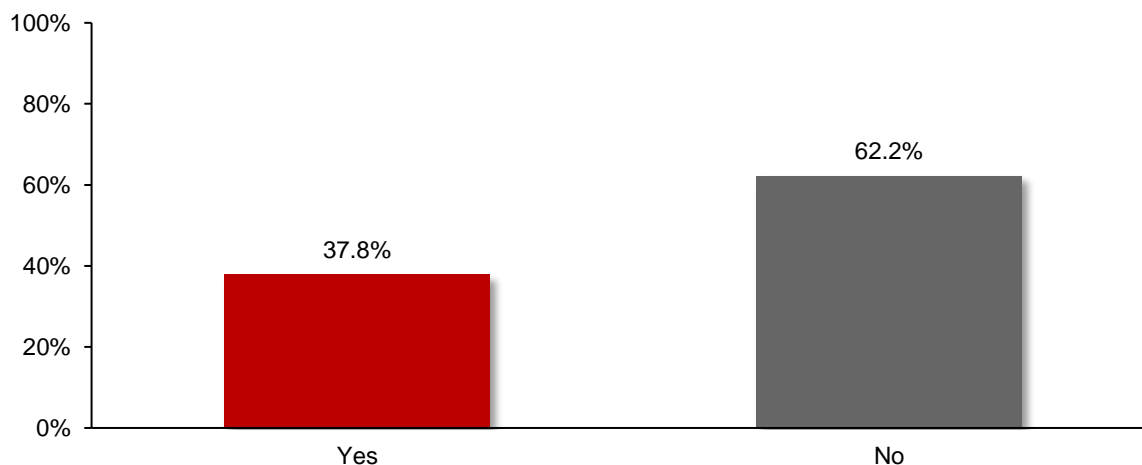

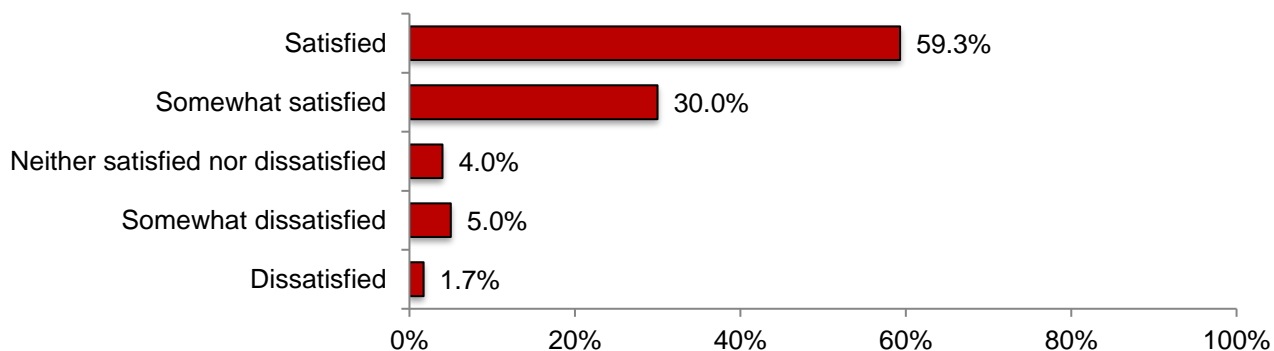

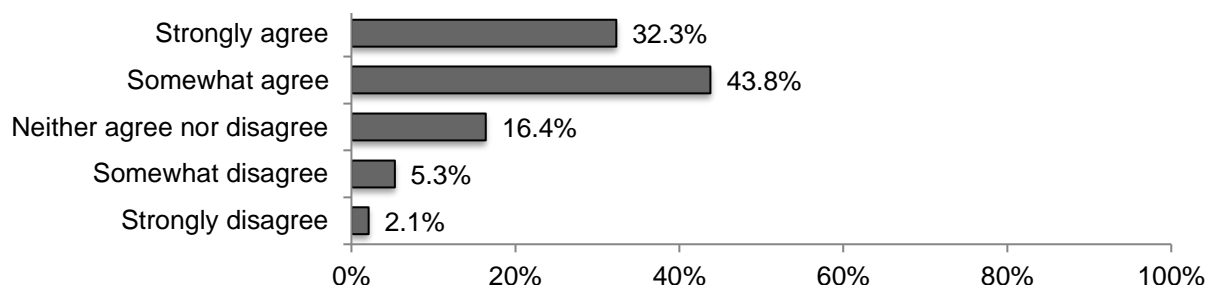

Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Master's (n = 1,214)

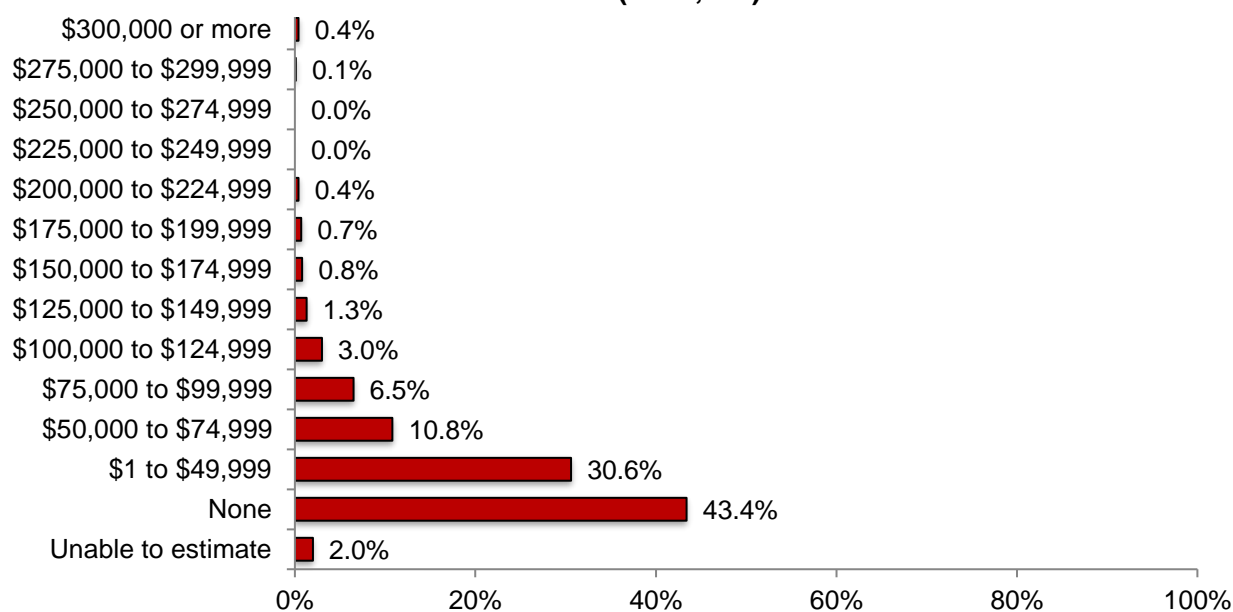


Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family? Master's (n = 1,215)



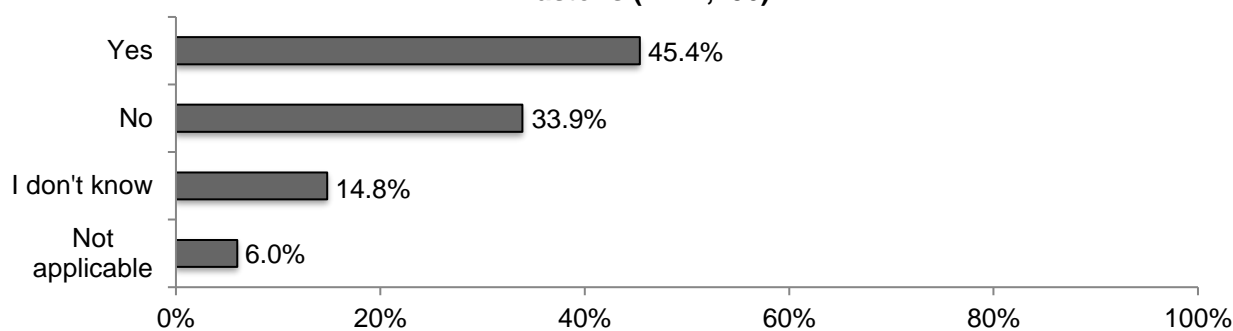

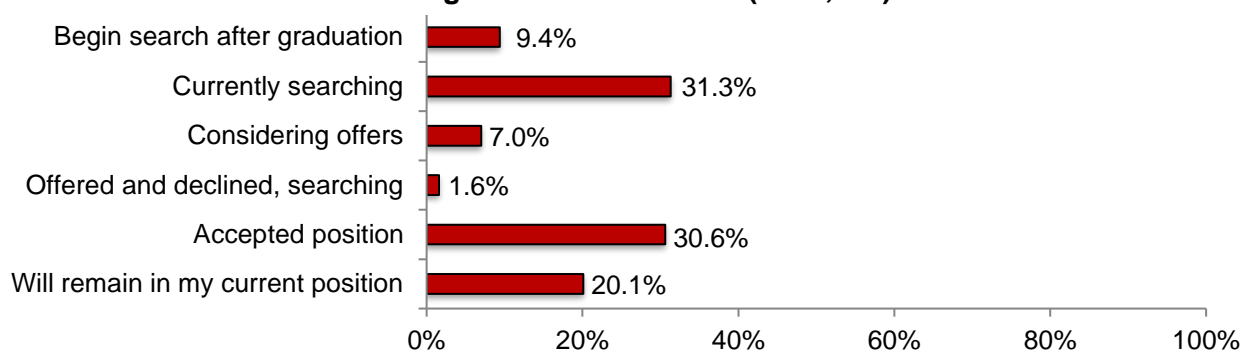

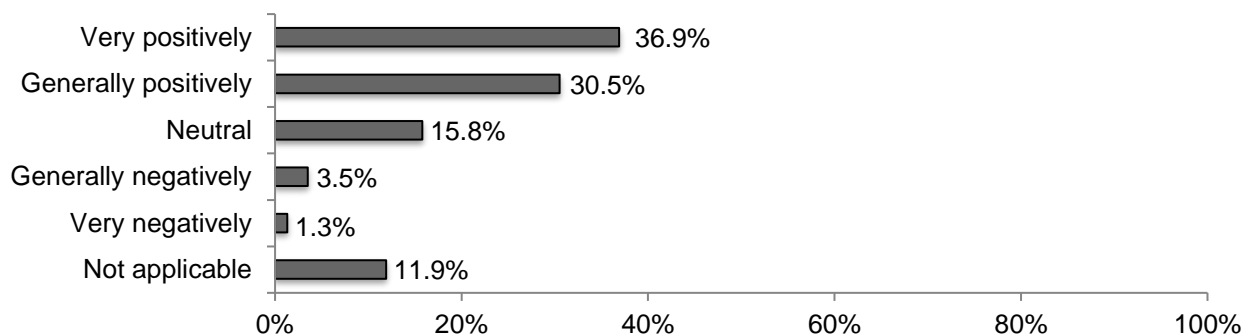

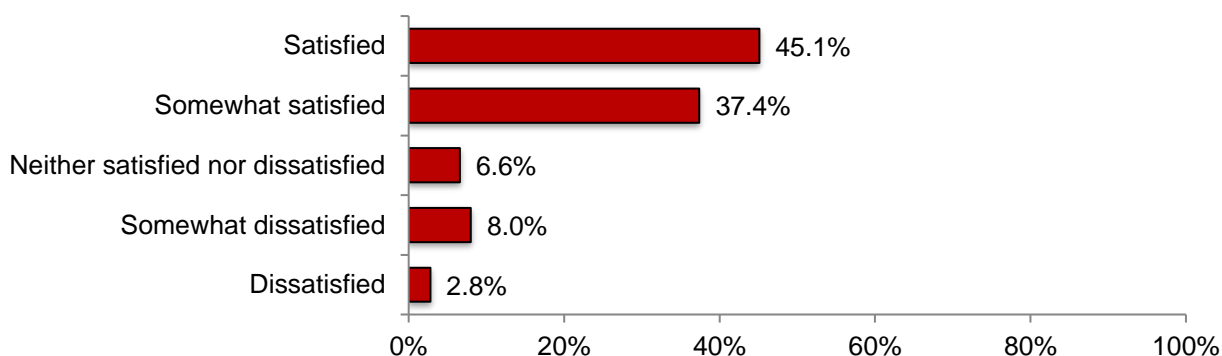

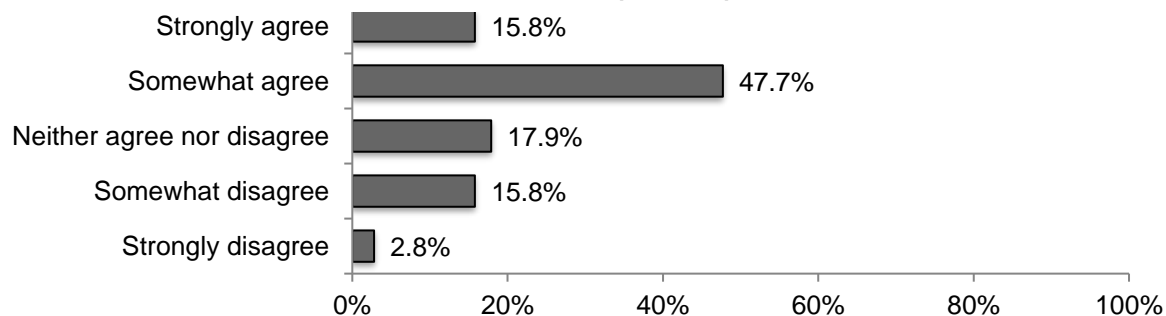

Looking back, how satisfied are you with your experience as a student at Ohio State overall? Professionals (n = 286)



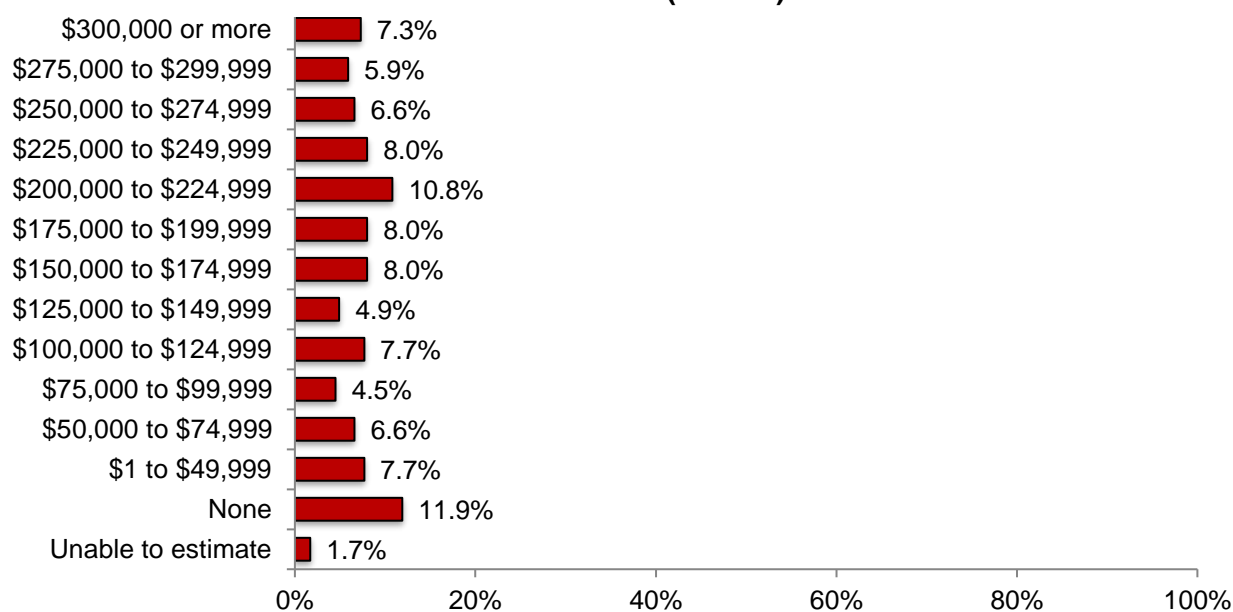
Reflecting back, to what extent do you agree that the benefits you have received from attending Ohio State were worth the financial costs to you and your family? Professionals (n = 285)

At the time you graduate, approximately what will be the total amount borrowed to finance your education that you are personally responsible for repaying?

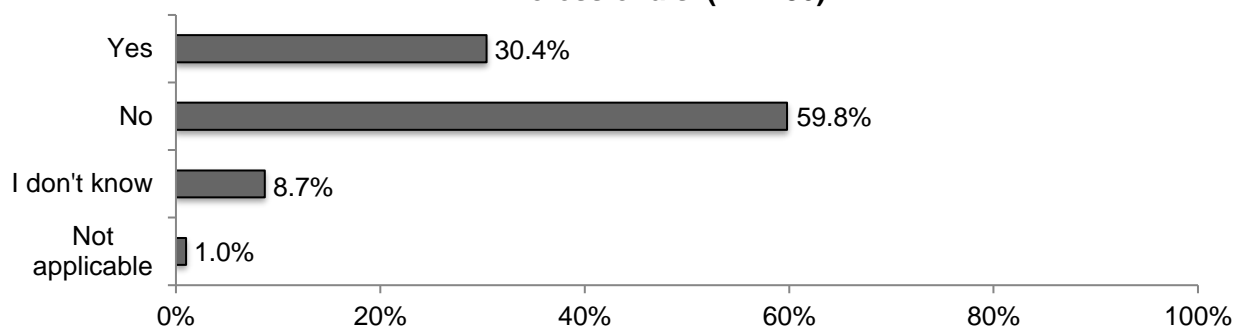

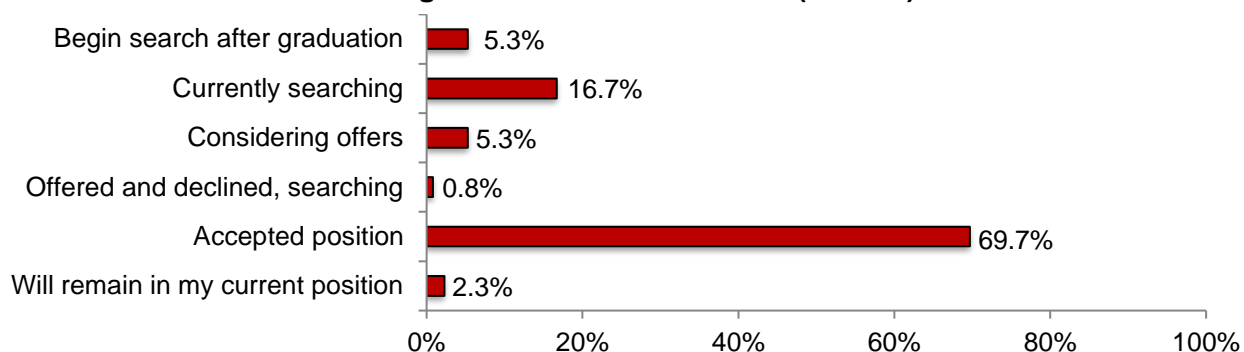
